## Pupil Equity Funding

As part of the Scottish Government's Scottish Attainment Challenge, Pupil Equity Funding is given to schools each year to help them support children's learning opportunities, particularly children impacted by poverty. The staff at Longridge Primary School are committed to ensuring equity for all children in our school and work hard to help all children achieve success. This year, our school w as given £9,720, and this money has been used to support a range of universal and targeted learning opportunities.

## Literacy

This year, we purchased 'Active Literacy' resources to support teaching literacy across all stages of the school. We also paid money alongside our cluster schools to pay for a Literacy Pedagogy Officer for one day per week.

We have also planned targered Literacy inteventions to develop identified children's:

- Comprehension Levels
- Fluency and Phrasing
- Writing Skills

#### Numeracy

We have purchased numicon rersources to support children's mathematical thinking in classrooms.

We have also planned targeted interventions to develop children's conceptual understanding in mathematics.






# Health & Wellbeing

### Participatory Budget

This year we had £292 to spend. The Lundy Model was used to plan for our PB spend, this ensures that children's views are heard, respected and acted upon in line with the UNCRC.
